Helen is the Music Director and Conductor of the award winning Blackpool Symphony Orchestra, Preston Opera, Lytham St. Annes Choral Society and the Lancashire Youth Symphony Orchestra. She works regularly with ensembles including Leeds Conservatoire Chamber Orchestra and Chamber Choir, Northern Opera Group, Outreach Opera, The Christie Musical Theatre Company and Salford Choral Society.

Helen read Music at Cambridge University and studied Conducting at the Royal Northern College of Music. She now studies and is mentored by Jessica Cottis.

In July 2021 Helen was selected to participate in the Royal Opera House Women Conductors' International

Masterclass conducting artists from the ROH and the City of London Sinfonia coached by Sian Edwards, Alice Farnham and Jessica Cottis. In June 2021 she was invited by the Royal Philharmonic Society to work with the Royal Northern Sinfonia as one of four emerging conductors in a project to advance gender equality on the podium. She has also conducted in International Masterclasses held at the RNCM with Mark Heron, Clark Rundell, Nicolas Pasquet, Gergeley Madaras, Matthew Wood and Morten Wensberg.

A passionate believer in the power of classical music to change lives, Helen is a board member for Orchestras Live connecting communities across England with world class orchestral experiences delivered by renowned professional orchestras.

Helen is also a regular guest on the Operacast pod covering the latest opera news. She has appeared on a panel for the Royal Philharmonic Society exploring the impact of the pandemic on the lives and work of classical musicians.

As a concert and recital singer Jane has appeared regularly in Britain, Europe and America. Highlights have included appearances at the Carnegie Hall, New York, the BBC Proms, the Wigmore Hall, the Edinburgh International Festival, the Berlin Festival, the Concertgebouw, Boston Symphony Hall, and the Musikverein, Vienna. She has collaborated with the Deutsche Symphony Orchester, Orchestre de Paris, San Paolo Symphony, Rotterdam Philharmonic, Pittsburgh

Symphony, San Francisco Symphony, Zurich Tonhalle and many more, with such conductors as Sir Simon Rattle, Sir Andrew Davis, Donald Runnicles, Antonio Pappano and Sir Mark Elder. Jane has given recitals at the Chatelet, Paris, London, Edinburgh, Geneva, Aix-en-Provence and Japan.

Operatic appearances have included Ring Cycles at Bayreuth, ROH and Scottish Opera, and other leading roles with Deutsche Oper, Berlin, San Francisco Opera, Chicago Lyric Opera and the major British companies.
